





A brief history of North and West Melbourne

First Nations country

The area was inhabited by the Woiwurrung and Boon Wurrung peoples of the Eastern Kulin Nation prior to European settlement. The area was characterised by gullies and high grounds, interspersed with creeks and ponds. A mixture of woodlands and grassy plains provided the traditional owners with a wide variety of natural resources. Significant to the area was the West Melbourne swamp, also referred to as the "Blue Lake".

Settlement

Surveys of the Maribyrnong and Yarra rivers were undertaken by surveyor Charles Grimes in 1803, but it wasn't until 1835 that John Batman arrived to start what was to become a thriving settlement.

As metropolitan Melbourne expanded, the First Nations people were gradually dispersed and dispossessed of their lands and livelihoods.

Discovery of gold

While the colony had developed during the 20 years or so since settlement, it was the discovery of gold in 1851 that led to North and West Melbourne becoming a service centre for those travelling to the goldfields. Factories and service industries sprang up to meet the needs of the diggers, and ships arrived to be loaded and unloaded of their goods and treasures.

Local Government

Originally encompassed within Melbourne's Bourke Ward, North Melbourne was declared a separate ward in 1855 and became the separate municipality of Hotham in 1857. In 1876 the Hotham Town Hall was opened, replacing an earlier one constructed in 1862, on the corner of Errol and Queensberry streets. Services such as surveying, drainage, roads, and the provision of reticulated water in 1872, were among the among the improvements that took place.















Transport

North and West Melbourne have both been well-served by public transport.

North Melbourne railway station was built in 1859, and redeveloped in 2009. In early years there were horse-drawn trams, replaced in 1890 by two cable tram routes.

One came from Spencer Street, while the other ran from Flinders Street to Flemington Bridge and was replaced by an electrified tram in 1935.

A proliferation of pubs

As North Melbourne developed and expanded so did the number of pubs. In the first decade of the 20th century there were 57 pubs in North Melbourne alone.

Many had Scots (Tam O'Shanter) or Irish (Limerick Arms) names. Homes were often small and overcrowded and pubs provided an escape. In the 1880s there were two "Coffee Palaces", residential hotels where alcohol was not served.

Football and other sporting clubs

There are two clubs that have stood the test of time. The Bowling Club, with its premises in Flagstaff Gardens, was founded in 1866. North Melbourne Football Club was founded in 1869.

Shopping

Fitzgerald's emporium, at 44 Errol St, opened in 1898 and attracted customers from far and wide as it operated a mail order service.

Errol St developed as the main shopping street. In the early 1930s the street was described as having a gala atmosphere, with shops remaining open and lights blazing for the crowds of people who moved up and down.

Population

Irish and Scots people were among the most populous of the early settlers, but subsequent migration has seen the development of Greek, Italian, and Maltese communities. The local markets attracted many Chinese marketeers. More recent waves of migration from all parts of the world have made the suburbs a diverse and multicultural society.

Morning

Start your day by strolling through the iconic sheds at Queen Victoria Market. A cup of hot Mörk Chocolate and a pastry should be the perfect way to fuel up for a busy day ahead.

Make your way to the West End, where you'll find West End Art Space, Studio Beans and Social Animals Barbershop. If you're up for a pampering, try a float at City Cave West Melbourne, or head torwards North Melbourne for a facial at Airs & Graces or a peel at Take Off Skin & Body. Continue strolling and get a fresh new pair of boots at Manfred's Shoe Lounge or refresh your favourite oldies.

Next, you'll find yourself browsing the many retail gems along Queensberry St – Radical Yes!, Spieledeluxe, Martin Fella, North Melbourne Bookstore and Ace Antiques.

Afternoon

Lunchtime presents a tricky decision.

Pastries and a coffee from Bread Club, traditional Japanese delicacies from 279 Café, burgers at Wonky Trolley or a classic pub feed at The Leveson. Town Hall or Central Club Hotel.

From there, get your art fix at Gallerysmith or One Star Gallery, with their ever-changing array of artists and exhibitions.

For some more retail therapy, find the joy of colour and gifts at Stranger than Paradise and Metta Chai, or pick up a rare vinyl at Heartland Records. These are musts for locals and visitors.

Night

We'll try to narrow down your dinner options, but with the smorgasbord of options on offer, it's never easy.

Whitebark Wine Bar, Willows & Wine, Bobbie Peels or Sosta Cucina are top picks. However, it is almost impossible to go past Manzé, the cosy, highly-awarded Mauritian local.

Now it's time to kick off the evening with your pick of show. Arts House, Comics Lounge or Club Voltaire boast year-round programs sure to satisfy the most discerning critic.

Finally, finish your (incredibly big) day with a wine and dessert at the recently refurbished Courthouse Hotel or Bistro de Paris.



Inspired by Melbourne's coffee culture — which is considered by many to be the best in the world — they have made it their mission to bring specialty hot chocolate onto the scene.







Coffee

6. APOLLO CAFÉ

Apollo Café is a re-imagining of a prestigious architectural landmark – The Mighty Apollo Gym – for the purpose of enjoying amazing coffee, food, friendships and functions.






